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PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

CRES Families,

With another senseless act of violence and yet another school shooting in our country, I write to you with sadness. These incidents create so much anxiety for students, families and staff, and are quite simply heartbreaking. I want you to know what measures we have in place and what we've done to prepare as a school and district.

We have district-wide and building-specific emergency plans that cover these and other emergency situations. We conduct ten emergency drills per year at CRES, the bulk of which are fire drills. We conducted a lockdown/stay-put drill in October where we played the sound school-wide (different from a fire alarm) and then had teachers review the process with students. We don't share the specifics of our plans outside the school for the safety of everyone - we don't want the general public to know about our exact procedures.

We have reviewed our lockdown process this year as administrators, with local law enforcement, and twice with the CRES faculty. In the last year I have conducted building walkthroughs with a state police officer and most recently, our local police detective. Both were impressed with the safety measures we had in place - neither had suggestions for additional measures we could implement in our school. Our custodial and maintenance staff also conduct routine safety checks to ensure our building is secure.

While there is a low likelihood of an event like this happening in our community, the chances are not zero. So we take our emergency planning seriously and review our plans with a focus on best practices on an ongoing basis.

Thank you for trusting us with your children.

With our COVID distancing requirements lifted we want to remind families of the following recent changes:

- Parents/guardians are welcome to join their child for lunch in our cafeteria - it's a special way to be with your child on their birthday, for example. Reach out to your child's teacher the day before so they are aware and let them know if you'd like to order an adult school lunch for \$4.50.
- Our Main Entrance lobby door is unlocked after school until 5:30 or the final public event of the night. This eases the flow of aftercare pickup and evening practices.
- We're looking for volunteers! Many opportunities are dependent on classroom teachers reaching out to you directly - some teachers have a greater need than others. If you'd like more chances to volunteer, here are ways to do so.

 - * Contact the CRES office if you're interested in volunteering as a recess monitor. We ask for a consistent time commitment each week for our planning.
- Finally, a reminder that our playground is open for families to stay and play after school. Please stay on the pavement or the 'slides' side of the playground until dismissal ends at 2:40. This will be much more enticing as the weather warms!




